Subject:- Grant of Conditional Permission to Jupiter Ayurved College & Tarini Ayurved Hospital, Nagpur, Maharashtra (Inst. ID AYU0186) with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely to **Jupiter Ayurved College & Tarini Ayurved Hospital, Nagpur, Maharashtra (Inst. ID AYU0186)** inspection of your College was conducted on **05.06.2023 & 06.06.2023 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the Conditional permission with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
3. Further, two faculties of your institution in the academic year 2022-23 were proven to be physically absent but working only on paper teacher and in accordance with section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020, regulation 3(1)(f) of RMS, 2016 as per the letter of MARBISM vide letter no 26-75/2021-visitiation dated 31/8/2021 and letter no. 3/2022/MARB/General Matter dated 17/8/22, **a penalty of rupees 50 lakh** was imposed on your institution as **two faculties namely Dr. Nagsen Madhavrao Punekar (AYAT00025) and Dr. Avinash Vishnu Bharti (AYST01926)** were proven to be physically not present but working only on paper teachers and same was communicated to you vide letter no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2022 dated 27.03.2023. Accordingly, a **reminder letter was sent to you vide letter of even no. dated 07.08.2023** for remittance of the imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 50 Lakh as two of your faculties as mentioned above were proven to be physically absent but working only on paper.
4. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report of the academic year 2023-24 was placed in the **52nd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **11.08.2023**. Board discussed and decided to withhold the permission process till the remittance of the imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 50 lakh.
5. Further, your college had filed an appeal before the Chairman and the appeal is under process at the level of the Commission. Looking to the urgency involved in the matter, owing to the ongoing admission process, the Commission Stayed the order passed by Medical Assessment and Rating Board vide letter ref. no. Teacher Verification/ MARB/2022 dated 27.03.2023 to the extent of penalty imposed by MARBISM and further directed the Board to issue the necessary permission to the college as per rules vide letter ref no. NCISM/Comm./OPT Appeal/ (2023-24)-(Maharashtra) dated 18.10.2023.
6. Therefore, **Grant of conditional permission is issued to Jupiter Ayurved College & Tarini Ayurved Hospital, Nagpur, Maharashtra (Inst. ID AYU0186) with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020** subject to the final outcome of the appeal and that college is fulfilling the following requirements:-

- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of **40 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
 8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
 9. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:**
 - i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
 10. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
